NEW QUIZ - April 2011

1. John Rollins drove his ball in soggy conditions and found his ball embedded in a pitch mark. Nearby spectators said it was in another ball's pitch mark. How should Rollins proceed?

2. Who is away? Your drive on a par three is 10 yards from the hole, and your competitor is on the green 40 feet from the hole. How should you proceed?

3. When playing a round, who tees off first on hole 1?

Prior QUIZ - March 2011

1. It's pouring rain, and you hope it is a short shower. So to protect yourself, you putt with one hand and hold the umbrella with the other. Your partner says that's cheating and not allowed, as it blocks you and your ball from the elements. You then said there is no penalty because somebody else was not holding umbrella for you.

Answer: Oh boy! Nice argument. Rule 14-2a says you can't make a stroke while accepting protection against the elements. But Decision 14-2/2 says you are not prohibited from protecting yourself from the elements, even while making a stroke.

2. Your father passed away, and left you a hickory stick club that has magical

powers. You want to declare the club out of play and keep it in the bag for sentimental and super-natural reasons. Can you?

Answer: Better hang it over the fireplace. Decision 4-4c/1 states there is nothing in the Rules that allows a player to declare a club out of play before the round.

3. When play was suspended recently, Stewart Cink marked his ball with a tee. The next morning, when removing the tee, some sand was now directly behind his ball, so he flicked the sand away. Is there any penalty?

Answer: His ball was considered in play after replacing it. Flicking the sand away was deemed testing the condition of the hazard, in breach of Rule 13-4a, and he had to add two penalty strokes to his score.
